Chronology of Temples and patrons:

Bakong Temple, c. 881, located in the old capital of Hariharālaya (now called Roulos), built by Indravarman I, dedicated to Shiva

Preah Ko, c. 880, located in the old capital of Hariharālaya (now called Roulos), built by Indravarman I, dedicated to Shiva

Ta Keo, c. 975-1000, built by Jayavarman V, dedicated to Shiva

Banteay Srei, c. 967, built by Yajñavaraha (guru of Jayavarman V), dedicated to Shiva

Baphoun, c. 1060, built by Udayadityvarman II, dedicated to Shiva

Angkor Wat, 1113-1150, built by Suryavarman II, dedicated to Vishnu

Bayon, c. 1200, built by Jayavarman VII, Buddhist

Angkor Thom, c. 1200, rebuilt by Jayavarman VII, imperial city

Ta Prohm, 1186, built by Jayavarman VII, Buddhist

Preah Khan, 1191, built by Jayavarman VII, Buddhist

Some terms:

asura – demons, anti-god

devata – god

gopura - gateway

naga – serpent

sikhara – tower over the central shrine

wat - temple
